*Passing of the Peace

Scripture Lessons: Jonah 3:1-5, 10; & Mark 1:14-20

Hebrew Lesson: Jonah 3:1-5, 10 – <u>Introduction</u>; This is the classic story of Jonah's attempt to flee from God's call for Jonah to go to Nineveh. Jonah boards a ship to escape but God creates a great storm and Jonah ends up in the belly of a huge whale. In the dark. Of course, Jonah prays for a rescue by promising God he will do better. Out of the dark belly of the whale, Jonah is coughed up on the dry land and in the light of day. Listen to how Jonah responds to God's second call in chapter 3, verses 1-5 from "The Message"

Gospel Lesson: Mark 1:14-20 – <u>Introduction;</u> In the very first chapter of Mark, Jesus calls his first disciples, Simon and Andrew, and James and his brother, John. Listen to the story of Jesus calling disciples – in the light in middle of the day from Mark 1:14-20 from The Message:

I don't mean the leaves' grip and shine or even the thrush's silk song, but the far-off fires, for example, of the stars, heaven's slowly turning theater of light, or the wind playful with its breath." — Mary Oliver

<u>Overview:</u> For some people today, even those who profess Christ and seek to follow Jesus, the 'Dark' is an enemy, an ever- challenging space to encounter. Of course, in the 'war-zones' of the world (Gaza, Ukraine, etc) people 'hover' in the dark, dank spaces of torn out buildings. Even though we in Frederick don't have to endure such horrid conditions, we still struggle with the cold of winter well as the dark places of our lives.

The profound, encouraging, and challenging words of the Psalmist in Psalms 139:12: ("...even the darkness is not dark to you; the night is as bright as the day, for darkness is as light to you.")

can both invite us to open ourselves to God's light when we are afraid in the dark and 'smack' us gently to awaken our spiritual gifts and resources that allow us to see God's 'safety-net' in the night This five-sermon series will challenge and inspire us to "Come and See God;" to allow God to soothe our fears in the darkness; and to discover how the light can add brilliance and
